Chemical Health Program

In collaboration with the Stillwater Area High School and St. Croix Valley Area Learning Center (ISD 834), Youth Service Bureau delivers school-based chemical health services that focus on prevention, education, and support services.

To comprehensively prevent and reduce youth chemical use, YSB provides an on-site Chemical Health Specialist. She offers direct-services to students and families, and develops, coordinates, and promotes prevention efforts.

Julia helps students and families access confidential services, including:

- **One-on-one support** for students who use substances, have a history of substance use, and/or are impacted by others' substance use, such as family members or friends
- **Support groups** such as concerned persons and sober support (offered depending on student need)
- **Family sessions** regarding youth substance use with focus on connecting families to resources
- **Parent and staff** consultation
- **Chemical health screenings and pre-assessments**
- **Referrals** to outside resources and follow-up support

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Julia helps students, families, and staff access a variety of preventative chemical health efforts, delivered district wide, including:

- **Newsletter to parents/staff** on chemical health issues (prevention, education, resources, etc.)
- **Student/parent presentations and resource sharing** on chemical health issues such as brain development, prevention tools for parents, peer pressure and refusal skills, and more
- **Staff workshops and trainings** such as the relationship between mental and chemical health, the role of adverse childhood experiences (ACES) in chemical health, signs, symptoms, and trends of chemical use, how to approach a student about their chemical health
- **Prevention projects** such as Public Service Announcements/educational videos/presentations/posters created with students, implementation of prevention curriculum, school-wide events around substance abuse education and prevention
- **Student groups** that are time-limited and skills focused (stress management, asset building)
- **Review** school policies and procedures regarding chemical health
- **Webpage** on school's website with resources for students and families – mental health too!
- **Chemical and mental health community collaborative** – leadership involvement in Washington County CONNECT

Julia also supervises and coordinates the YSB chemical health team which consists of Chemical Health Specialists in ISD 622 and ISD 833.
